GRIDS

1. I read frequently, and for pleasure, recommending books to my peers.

Range of texts

Word Reading

1. I can identify grammatical features used by the writer to impact on the reader: varied sentence lengths, rhetorical questions, empty words

2. I can identify the use of figurative language such as similes and personification.

3. I can recognise the writer's point of view and discuss it.

4. I can identify and comment on the writer's choice of vocabulary, giving examples and explanation.

Language for effect

1. I can organise my evidence, to provide reasoned justifications for my views

2. I can make predictions on what might happen based on details in the text.

3. I can make inferences such as inferring a character's feelings, thoughts or motives from their actions. I can justify what I say with supporting evidence.

Making Inferences

1. I can use context to understand what I have read and can discuss the meaning of different words.

2. I can make comparisons between other different texts, talking about similarities and differences.

3. I can summarise the main ideas drawing from more than one paragraph.

4. I can ask questions to improve my understanding of a text.

5. I can identify and explain themes and conventions in a text.

6. I can evaluate how texts are structured.
